

## HOME & GARDEN

1. **Office hours to enter exhibits will begin on May 1st, 2026, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. Entries can also be made on-line on the website [www.livestockbreedersassociation.com](http://www.livestockbreedersassociation.com).**
2. **Entries close June 5th and the office will not accept any entries following that date.**

No Refunds. No Substitutions.

**\*\*Registration for the Saturday Flower Show can be made before 9 p.m., Friday, June 12th, but can only be made by going to the LBA office.**

3. **Your entry form must be filled out with your name, address and telephone number.** Carefully review the prize list to ensure that, depending on the section and class, you have selected the correct numbers on the registration forms and labels.

**\*\*\*Competitors are asked to pick up their tags prior to June 5th and have them filled out and fastened securely.**

4. **Fees are \$2 per entry (taxes included) \*\*Excluding Section 10 & Section 17.**
5. **All exhibitors must obtain their own exhibitor number.**
6. **There will be entries for "Juniors", ages 5 to 17. They can enter any of the adult entries, but they cannot enter a class below their age level. Please read the entry lists carefully.**
7. **Entries can be brought in Monday, June 8th, between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. Tuesday, June 9th, between 10 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. All entries must be brought in by Wednesday, June 10th, before 11 a.m.**
8. **Plants & Flowers must be in place Thursday, June 11th, before 11 a.m.**  
Late arrivals may be displayed but are not eligible for judging. **Potted plants shown in previous years are eligible to be entered.**
9. **Saturday Flower Show exhibits must be in place June 13th before 11 a.m.** Late arrivals may be displayed but are not eligible for judging.
10. **An exhibitor can only win 2 prizes per class in any section.**
11. **10 articles** must be entered before a free week pass can be given to an exhibitor and another pass for each additional 10 entries.
12. **Items exhibited must remain on display until the close of the fair on Sunday, June 14th, and can only be picked up after 4:00 p.m. and until 5:30 p.m.**
13. Articles soiled, defaced by wear or previously shown in the Home & Garden Section of Expo Ormstown are not eligible for competition. The exception is Section 12.
14. All exhibitors are responsible for their own exhibits, and all exhibits are at the exhibitor's sole risk. The Association will not assume responsibility for the removal, packing and shipping.
15. No prizes will be awarded to any exhibitor for which there is no class.
16. No additional wording or photos can be included with the exhibit or on the exhibitor's tag, except where stated.
17. The judge's decision can only be reviewed after an appeal during the time of the fair by contacting Darleen Kerr Sabetta.
18. Any complaint or concern should be brought to the attention of Darleen Kerr Sabetta during the week of the fair.
